As we sit down to leaf through this festive edition of the parish magazine, we may well be aware of life trying to push us into an ever more frenzied whirlwind of planning, shopping, cooking, wrapping, writing cards, and thinking of or doing all the other things that go along with Christmas preparations. The churches in the benefice also are gearing up for a busy time with additional and joyful services like carol services, Christingle, and of course Midnight Mass and Christmas morning services.

And at the heart of this all is...? The obvious answer may be "Jesus!" and we would not be wrong, but before he could be born something else had to happen first.

And it started with the angel Gabriel visiting Mary and telling her that something momentous would happen. And Mary, after pondering what the angel had told her, said "Yes."

The highlight of December is of course the celebration of the birth of Jesus. And alongside the frenzy of Christmas planning and preparations, there is a much calmer but no less joyful and exciting sense of waiting. special Christmas music, perhaps read slowly and ponder the first chapter of the Gospel of Luke, or anything else that helps us to experience that sense of joyful anticipation. The second week, light two candles – and so on. What will you do to prepare for the celebration of the Light of the World born into our midst?

Notice of Stoke Orchard and Tredington Parish Council Meeting

The next Parish Council Meeting will be on Tuesday December 6th at 7.00pm. at the Community Centre, Stoke Orchard and will be held according to standard Parish Council Meeting regulations. The Council will continue the Clerks special Powers Facility invoked for Covid Regulations for the foreseeable future. The Full Minutes of the November meeting will be available when approved by Council.

New Parish Councillors.

At the November Parish Council Meeting, the Council were extremely happy to welcome Graham Ferguson and George Fairbairn as new members of the Stoke Orchard and Tredington Parish Council. The Council was extremely grateful to Su Shorrock, Chair of the Community Speed Watch, who was also interested in becoming a Councillor but kindly reserved her application until the Full Council Elections in May 2023.

The Council did investigate the possibility of expanding the Council to 8 Councillors but apparently, according to the Local Government regulations, we are governed by the number of voters who are recorded in the Parish. However, as was started last month, we are expanding the responsibility of the work within the Parish by incorporating Sub Committees so allowing more residents to take an active part in the governance and work within the Parish.

On the 17th of November, members of the Parish Council met with members of the Junction 10 team. This is the group who are in the process of finalising the Application for the Expansion of M5 Junction 10 into a 4-way junction. The ramifications of this expansion on our Parish and other surrounding rural parishes like Elmstone Hardwick, Uckington, Boddington and Staverton are tremendous. The late Councillor Phil Ternouth was an expert on these matters having been a town planner with traffic management experience and we have been doing our best to maintain the work he started. Indeed, our meeting centred around some of the proposed Traffic management levels he had had been so keen for the J10 team to supply. The figures provided seem somewhat flawed and the Council were keen to explain that some developments had been missed and base figures were outdated.

The J10 team offered us support in HGV control and we were keen to procure safe routes for pedestrians, cyclists and also horses this being a rural area and organised safety areas around the school and within both villages. The Councillors listed serious concerns over the Junction at the Gloucester Old Spot as there had been no recognition of the danger at that point. Finally, the J10 members admitted they had looked at this site but were adamant that it needed no further alterations. We await the response to our concerns as the Application will be submitted in February. That Application may yet still fail if it can be proved that it is based on unproven design and traffic management. It is for this reason, if it fails, they lose the £210,000,000 grant from Homes England that is financing the deal, they need our support. However when we made the point that without the suggested Junction 9 improvements or J9a replacement the problems could only get worse, they did agree to further our discussions. If only we could a achieve some improvements— footways, traffic calming and cycle ways as part a deal for our support. Watch this space.






2022—a Year of Mixed Emotions

EYFS Update

This term we have started our new Talk For Writing text 'Polar Bear Polar Bear'. We have enjoyed exploring the Arctic alongside this: freeing animals from ice by investigating the different ways we can melt it. We have been looking at where the Arctic is on the globe and thinking about the similarities and difference with where we live. We have also been looking at the different animals that live in the Arctic ready to begin innovating our story map.

In Maths, we have begun exploring the composition of our number of the week, using the part-part-whole model- we were keen to show Year 5 and 6 our learning! We have also been using the language of 'more' and 'fewer' to compare quantities.

In phonics, we moved onto learning digraphs (two letters that that make one sound) and children have been doing brilliantly at using their robot arms and blending hands to support them with their reading. We have even been using our spelling sequence to help us write words on our own!

Year 1 & 2 Update

Year 1&2 have been on a nature walk; learning all about the 4 seasons; and focusing on different features of Autumn. In English we have started a exploring a wishing tale 'The Land of Rubbish'. We have created a story map and thought about how the man in the story might be feeling. In PSHE we have been exploring physical exercise and have carried out lots of experiments involving running, jumping, skipping and star jumps to test the affect it has on our bodies. We have also started our nativity rehearsals ready for the end of the term which we are all very excited for!

Year 3 & 4 Update

The weather has been miserable but we have been having fun in Y3/4! This term, we have started out new football and gymnastic units in P.E. It has been great to see all children using old and new skills during these sessions. During our English sessions, we have just reached the end of writing our own Non-Chronological Reports about animals. The children loved learning about new animals and writing exciting reports using lots of technical vocabulary. It has been amazing to see how confident all children are becoming with re-calling their times tables. We love playing times table games in Y3/4!

Year 5 & 6 Update

Over the last two weeks, Year 5/6 have been getting imaginative through creating their own rainforest creature and writing a non-chronological report all about it. The children have started some challenging work on fractions and have been developing and deepening their understand on this topic. The class have also been learning about the religion and beliefs of Islam and exploring how this could apply to their own lives. Mr Holdaway has sung the children's praises regarding their behaviour during their Forest School sessions. Finally, we have started our new Geography topic of Global Map Work during which the children are exploring continents, hemispheres, oceans and climate zones.
