

HAPPY CHRISTMAS AND A BLESSED 2023!

No, I am not confused about when Christmas is! I really am wishing you all a Happy Christmas in January! The Anglican Church celebrates Christmas for a number of weeks, all the way up to what is called Candlemas (this year on Sunday 29th January at the 10am Benefice service at Forthampton) when we remember Jesus' parents bringing him to the temple, and while they were there, two people in the temple, Anna and Simeon, both recognised Jesus as the one they had been waiting for, as the light of the world that had come into their midst. Throughout Christmas-tide (i.e. the weeks between Christmas and Candlemas) we will hear of others who saw in Jesus something very special, and so this month is a good time to consider and think about who Jesus is to you.

If you are not quite sure, you are in the good company of many others who met Jesus throughout his life in person, and those who meet him now through Scriptures and the words of others. It's not easy. And words are often not sufficient. But then one day, we too can have our own experience and recognition of Jesus. This may be because of something someone says or reads out, because of a song or prayer that suddenly takes on a new meaning, because we are in a special place or time of life that makes us feel closer to Jesus, or it may just happen unexpectedly.

What does help is being in the presence of others who, like us, are either seeking for or have experienced the presence of Jesus in their life. And there are plenty of opportunities to meet with others, either at coffee mornings or at one of our services or at one of the warm spaces in this Benefice. Everyone is welcome to meet and chat and get to know each other. If you have not been to a coffee morning or one of our services, perhaps that could be your New Year's Resolution?

Check out the parish magazine for something near you and who knows, you may make new friends!

Parish Council Business Update.

Last month we reported on the meetings and negotiations we had been having with M5 Junction 10 expansion team and our concerns over the further increase in traffic through the villages having regard to the J.9 problems which continue ad the suggestion the traffic avoiding J9 will increase when J10 work is complete.

We have since received correspondence from the J9 team. We first started talking with them in 2017 and were expecting a suggested route and plans for relief for the Junction within 12 to 18 months. The correspondence states that they hope to be able to have a plan for public consultation later this year.. If the A417 at Crickley Hill is anything to go by, we could be waiting for another 10 years!!

Over the past month we have been plagued with road closures, traffic lights and roadworks. The road works near the bridge at Tredington was for Gas main repairs. Apparently the main had suffered from a large amount of water in the main and they opened it up to drain it. Bozards lane has been closed for the section from The Grain drier to the A435 to be completely re-laid. It looks great—for the time being!!

January 2023 Update.

During 2022, your local CSW group has undertaken many activities to help to tackle speeding issues within our villages including: -

- 1. Numerous speed monitoring sessions the results of which have been shared with the police;
- 2. Finalising the funding of 12 Village Gates and working with all the relevant parties especially Highways to achieve their installation;
- 3. Securing funding for our own Speed Guns to allow sessions to take place in a timely way;
- 4. Applying for funding from a joint GCC and Police Commissioner's fund to provide bin stickers (secured) and two Speed Cameras (pending)
- 5. Working with our local primary school to improve road safety around the school we continue to canvass Highways regarding implementation..

Our work involves close co-operation with Gloucestershire police and along with other CSW groups, we can share an email message received recently from our Road Safety and Traffic Management officer:

I would like to take the opportunity to offer my thanks and that of Gloucestershire Constabulary for the great efforts that you and your teams of committed volunteers have all put in to collect the data to monitor speeds in your villages and towns.

Your efforts are so important as a visual tool to remind and educate motorists of the importance of compliance with speed limits for safety and environmental reasons and you have all made a difference on both counts.

The data that you supply is invaluable in identifying priority locations of concern and allowing our Camera Enforcement Team to get into your areas of concern for enforcement...your efforts have resulted in many thousands of advisory letters being sent around the country and resulted in a more targeted approach from our Camera Team which allows them to work more efficiently and effectively.

Please help us to make your villages safer places to live - please respect others and drive thoughtfully
