# **April 2023.**

#### The Monthly Message—April 2023

This month starts with what is for me the most important event of the Church's year: Easter!

In our church services we re-tell the story of Jesus' last days, his death, and then the miraculous event of his resurrection. Having walked through Lent and perhaps (re)made our commitment to following Christ, we follow him into death – and with that, we also follow him in new life.

Although spring starts on the 21<sup>st</sup> of March, it is in April that nature seems to burst into life: the trees and hedges are greening, blossoms and flowers are out in full, flocks of lambs jump around, the days are getting longer and hopefully sunnier and warmer too. These are signs of new life that are easy to see. But it seems that the new life Jesus portrayed was less easy to see. When Mary Magdalen went to the tomb where Jesus' body was laid and found only the linen wrappings but not his body, she wept in the garden and failed to recognise Jesus, instead presuming him to be the gardener. That is, until he spoke to her: "Mary..."

I think there is something extraordinarily beautiful, significant, and symbolic about the use of the voice, the breath, for Jesus to be recognised. Isn't it the breath that gives us and sustains us through life, the breath that inspires us, the breath that in Jesus' voice speaks of new life after death? Isn't it that same voice that calls all that lives into life? The prophet Isaiah hears the voice of God: "Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are mine" (chapter 43 verse 1b).

I believe we are all called, called into life first of all, then called into becoming the best version of who we are, called into new life where endings are beginnings and beginnings are endings. I wonder whether we can hear that call on our life, or a call on the communities of which we are part, or a call on the benefice. What little or loud voice do you hear? What is it calling you or us to be or become? As we celebrate the Easter feast at the start of this month, may we walk through life in faith and joy and hope into the new life laid out for us.

#### LITTER PICK DAY

#### The Stoke Orchard and Tredington Parish Council and Stoke Orchard



Community Centre organised a village litter pick on Sunday 5th March. Twelve residents took part and, in the space of 90 minutes, covered areas including Armstrong Road, the MUGA, the bridle path, Pennycress and Stoke Road from the community Centre to

the motorway bridge. Hot drinks and treats were enjoyed after a great morning's work.

We have limited equipment available at the centre. However, Tewkesbury Borough Council now runs a **litter picking scheme** and residents (over the age of 18 years) who sign up will receive their own equipment. Additionally, you would be covered by the



council's indemnity insurance scheme. If a number of residents from both villages sign up, litter picking sessions could be set up more flexibly across our community. Importantly, you are <u>not required</u> to commit to any set time or dates. **Please sign up today!** <u>https://</u>

#### New Paved area and Entrance to Playground.



Two new paved areas have been completed this month giving better facilities for the outside tables at the Community Centre while still maintaining a little grassed area. This work has been planned for two years and we have at last managed to secure the S106

money for the project. The second area is a new entrance for the Playground. The gateway on to the road side has been closed for child

safety for over a year now and the new entrance now complies with regulations that all play enclosed play areas have two available exits. The gate will be hung in the next few days and a Safety zone created in the car park.



#### Richard's Ramblings.

Many of you will know by now that I have decided to retire from the Parish Council. It has been a very difficult choice after serving the community for many years. A time I admit I have found fulfilling but

times and circumstances change and we all must move on and let others take responsibility. I have always been interested in our local history and I hope in the next couple of Ramblings to pick a few interesting things I have seen and some I have picked from the Minute Books of the Parish Council since the 1935 when the Council as we know it was formed.



Manor Farm, our family home for 61 years, was bought by Harry Bishop from the Wedgewood Estate in 1909. He was my Great Grandfather and Tewkesbury Mayor in 1917. The Bishop side of the family being traced back to the 1500's in Tewkesbury. That family connection is one of the reasons I am so interested in local history, enjoy the research and am fascinated by the findings.

I was checking some old minutes of the Parish Council this week and an entry in 1846 for Stoke Orchard Parish contains resolutions regarding highways including a request for permission to sell parish property to pay for repairs to roads rendered almost impassable "from the great quantity of materials which have been drawn along them for the formation of the Rail Road"; there was also a call for funds for "repair and alterations to chapel, 1842-1844." One presumes that is the chapel at the end of Banady Lane—or had that been built by then—it was on the map in 1888? However, the Church of St James the Great was referred to as a chapel in early maps and it could easily have been that building

It was not until 1929 that Tredington became allied to Stoke Orchard instead of Tewkesbury and 1935 when the new Parish Council including both Civil Parishes was formed. That was under the Cheltenham Rural District Council that covered us up until 1974. The joining of the two civil parishes previously under different District Councils appears to have caused some rearranging as rates and responsibilities had to be apportioned elsewhere. The first Annual Meeting of the new Council on the 20th September 1935, was held at Tredington School with Mr W. Clegg in the Chair and Messrs. E Savery, W. Glover and F.J. Harris attending. After preliminaries were covered, the main business was to arrange with the Cheltenham RDC that the whole Parish should be covered by the Cheltenham Fire Brigade, provided that the costs would not be too high! Following that, Mr Harris (Uncle Frank as we called him as children) complained that the kerb stones in Tredington were very unsafe and it was agreed that the Clerk should write a letter to the Borough Surveyor to draw his attention to "dangerous stones projecting into the road and liable to cause serious accidents."

The final item on that first meeting was a report that a footpath known in Stoke Orchard as "The Alley" on Dean Lane had been obstructed and passage was difficult. It was agreed to write to the errant landowners that it was essential the all obstructions were to be removed. That is quite amusing as some 50/60 years later we spent several meetings discussing the same problem as to whose responsibility it was to keep that right of way open! And to whom it belonged.

In the minutes of the Annual meeting in 1936, the Chairman , Mr. W. Clegg, reported that the roads in Tredington were not receiving the attention they had in the past from the road cleaners, the ditches needed attention and the ditch from the Church gate to the Swilgate should be re-opened, The Village septic tank by the brook needed attention and finally, the footbridge over the Swilgate from Rudgeway needed attention. There are two Rudgeways, and one presumes this is the bridge on the footpath from Tredington Village Hall. The Clerk promised to inform the Borough Surveyor of such matters! Oh Yes, the footpath at Stoke Orchard was now satisfactory as reported by Mr Glover.

#### Taken from the School Newsletter

We have had lots of exciting developments in school over the last few weeks; these have included the set up of the new EYFS classroom and the arrival of our new gymnastics equipment. Last year, we were fortunate enough to be successful in securing £5000 worth of funding from the Sedbury Trust. As a result, we have been able to purchase new portable wall bars, mats and benches. Over the next few weeks, the staff will be receiving further training in how to use the equipment ready for the children to use within their gymnastics lessons throughout the summer term.

It was wonderful to see so many parents, carers and family members at our Welcome Wednesday session last week. We are continually looking for ways to involve the community within school life and to showcase the amazing work the children have been doing.

It's so nice to be beyond Covid restrictions and out and about again! We've had 2 trips which have taken place over the past fortnight: all of KS2 visited GE Aviation; and Reception and Year 1 joined with Bishops Cleeve Primary to take part in a LEGO workshop last week! The children had a fantastic time on both trips; and behaviour and attitude were absolutely exemplary. We're very proud of how they have represented the school.

#### Stoke Orchard and Tredington Parish Council Community Speed Watch



# Information from Gloucestershire Police Community Speedwatch team:

Stoke Orchard and Tredington CSW monitoring has led to regular visits by the police to conduct enforcement sessions.

#### Enforcement in 2022:

The speed van visited Stoke Rd on 26 occasions in 2022 resulting in 274 speeders captured, 3 mobile phone use and 14 no seat belts Tredington at the village hall was visited with hand held cameras on 13 occasions with 106 speeders captured. Stoke Rd by Armstrong Road was also visited on 8 occasions with hand held kit and 23 speeders captured.

#### Stoke Orchard and Tredington CSW -Summary Information

During 2022, the CSW group operated on 22 occasions from May to December between Stoke Orchard and Tredington identifying 396 speeding vehicles for letters from the police. Note, we are limited now in sending in registrations numbers for 15 vehicles per sessions only. Hence we have reduced monitoring sessions to 30 minutes especially during winter.

So far in 2023, the CSW group operated on 6 occasions recording 75 speeding vehicles forwarded to the police for action.

During a random selection of CSW Camera operations between July 2022 and March 23, the percentage of vehicles speeding varied between 82% and 34% of all vehicles checked. A fuller report will be included in the **Annual Report to Council at the Annual Parish Meeting**.
