Remember, remember...

Not just the 5th of November (Guy Fawkes night, and All Saints & All Souls services around the Benefice, but also the 10th (Deerhurst & Apperley School hold their annual Remembrance service on The Green), the 11th (Remembrance Day, with services around the county – please check the Abbey and Cathedral websites for further details), and the 12th (Remembrance services around the Benefice)!

Sunday 5th November is a day of highs and lows. In the morning, we will celebrate All Saints (the official day for this is 31st October) i.e. remember those who died for their (Christian) faith, often as martyrs, throughout the ages and are now saints in heaven. Then at 4pm in the afternoon we will hold a special service in Apperley Village Hall to commemorate All Souls (the official day for this is 1st November) i.e. all whom have died, more specifically those we have known personally.

At this service we will read out names of people we wish to remember, and if you have names you wish to be read out please let us know on apperleypriest@gmail.com or vicky.fowkes@live.co.uk. After the service, we will share hot or cold drinks, cake and biscuits, and of course memories of those whose names were read out.

With all of this going on, we might be forgiven for thinking that the long period of what the church calls 'ordinary time' has come to an end. It has not! Ordinary time lasts till the first Sunday of Advent, which this year falls on the 3rd December. So we have the whole of the month of November to remember remember... that ordinary time is the time of year in which there are no great celebrations but instead is 'simply the continuous, faithful, weekly attention to what it means to live out daily what we say we believe when we're at those mountain-

top moments of the spiritual life' (Joan Chittister: The Liturgical Year, p.183). It is easy to remember the highs and lows of life; less easy to remember the day to day ordinary events. And yet, that is exactly what Joan Chittister reminds us to do: to take the moments of great memories into our ordinary life.

How do your religious or spiritual beliefs support you throughout the day to day routines?

You are very welcome to come along to any of the services or events, and thereby turn an ordinary day into an extraordinary one!

Due to the outcome of the Harper Crewe Meeting on October 18th, (see below,) they propose holding a further meeting on November 8th. With this in mind .The Parish Council have cancelled the Extraordinary Meeting on October 24th and are considering postponing the meeting on Nov. 7th. This will allow the Parish Council to consider any further changes proposed by the developers, having consideration to Tewkesbury Borough Council agreeing to a delay in the consideration of the Application.

Just when I thought I might have a calmer month, we're busier than ever. I'm learning on the hoof with a lot of what goes on and realising that our Parish Council is rather like running a fairly large business! Whoever says men can't multitask wants to try this job! □

So, what has been going on this month...

 On the back of the public meeting in September, the developer Harper Crewe Ltd, is making a presentation at the community centre on Wednesday 18 October. I will do a report on this in the next newsletter. The answers from this and warrantable residents comments will form the basis of the official PC response to the application to TBC.


- An extra Parish Council meeting has been called to minute the PC's formal response to the development to TBC. This will be at the community centre on Tuesday 24th October at 7pm.
- Negotiations have been full-on with TBC regarding the contributions the developer will have to make, should the development go ahead. These must be done in advance of any decision by TBC regardless of any outcome. We are resolute in attempting to get the best we can for the community I assure you. I want to personally thank Cllr Susan Shorrock for the vast amount of work over many hours she has done on this.
- I'm sure you will be pleased to know that negotiations on the Land by the Chapel are finally nearing a conclusion after some 12 years of trying. Solicitors are now instructed and provided there are no hiccups with the process, this should be finalised in the next month or two. (Said he ambitiously)!
- Cotswold Oak Ltd, who are building the development next to Manor
 Farm, wish to perform remedial sewage work across the village green
 at the end of Swan Lane. This has to be carefully managed legally to
 ensure that the work is done properly, and that the area is returned to
 its previous condition.
- On Sunday 22nd October, we hope to have several volunteers to help tackle the overgrown areas on the Orchard Estate POS. Starting at 10am, we want to try and strim, cut, prune and burn our way to a tidier open space. I loved Cllr Graham Ferguson's description of the weed burner as 'our flame thrower'!
- In between all that, a dog bin, recycle bins for the playpark, and benches for the Pennycress pear tree land have been purchased and will be installed.
- Finally, our clerk, Ms Jules Owen, sadly lost her mum in late September. I'm sure you would all join me in sending our deepest condolences at this sad time.

My Flood Wardens Report—October 21st 2023.

It is Saturday 21st and I am sitting at my desk in my office, completing the Newsletter, making updates for the P.C. Chairman and entering the Community Speed Watch page when in the bottom right hand corner of the screen, a message has flashed up. It is an email from the level gauge at the Swilgate Bridge at the bottom of Tredington.

The message from "TVA_Admin@timeview2.net" reads "GLOUCESTERSHIRE TREDDINGTON Chan1: 1.448m Return to Normal Alarm Setpoint: 1, 1.45 Current Value: 1.44773 m Alarm Time: 2023-10-21 15:30:00" The graph below shows that the brook level had finally gone down below flood alarm level. It went UP past 1.5mtr level on Wednesday. 5 days is a long time for it to be in flood alarm level 1.




below the 1.5 and 2.00 metre levels, those of us with access get a message and an email. We have had four in the last three days which is a record!! And we don't want any more, but it is a sign of the times and those peaks are mainly

due to run off from Cheltenham and Bishops Cleeve combined. However, the last 36 hours have been different. The slope down after the second peak is not a steep as after the first. The Swilgate actually flooded the road in Tredington around 4.00pm as seen by the level on the graph. The Dean Brook gauge in Stoke Orchard peaked an hour earlier at 3.00pm and was a much higher than usual in the 2nd peak on Friday and shows that rain in Bishops Cleeve contributed to the higher Swilgate flow yesterday.

Wymans Brook gauge shows similar levels on Wednesday and Friday.





Travelling to Cheltenham around 11.30am on Friday 20th, it was

evident that the systems in Bishops Cleeve were overwhelmed with manhole covers lifted and water running down the road from the Cheltenham North Rugby Club to the Railway bridge and then from the railway bridge all the way to the Airfield Gateway with the usual flooding by Ashleigh Lodge. The main roadside ditch from the



Juliana Group entrance all the way to Old Forge Cottages was full to



overflowing and water running across and down the road.



As a Parish Council, we have tried since Pennycress was developed, to get that roadside ditch maintained alongside. We did get

a definitive answer as to whose responsibility it is, they all still refuse to do the job!! The increase in the Culvert under the Railway Line, which I reported two years ago, has exacerbated the problems. With steady increase of periods of high rainfall, Stoke Road drainage from Bishops Cleeve to the Dean Brook by Old Forge Cottages needs reviewing and upgrading.

PLEASE REMEMBER slow down when driving through floods. You may push water into nearby properties and there may be a manhole missing! The Police have written off two cars hitting potholes in Tredington floods
