A couple of years ago, I ditched the idea of New Year's Resolutions, so I don't have any for now - however I did make some resolutions during 2024 which I put into practice almost as soon as the ideas came into my head.

I started running more regularly in the second half of 2024. This meant I was able to complete the Apperley Quarter Marathon in September. What really helps me is running with others, and although I am nowhere near fast enough to join a running club, I have two colleagues who run at similar pace as mine and we meet up every week or other week to run anything between 3 and 6 miles. That commitment to run together also makes it easier to run in between on my own, as I want to stay fit enough to run those distances.

There will be something new at this start to 2025, though. Or rather: someone new, because we will have an ordinand on placement (someone who is training to be ordained). Her name is Melissa, and she will be with us throughout January and February to experience life in rural parish ministry. You will meet her at services and meetings and coffee mornings and other events - please do go and say hello, and share with her your views on what it's like to be part of rural community and church life.

And finally, a huge THANK YOU to all of you who contributed to all that happened during Advent and Christmas and throughout the year, both in the churches and the communities we are part of. It is a blessing and a privilege to be alongside, and life here would not be the same without all that you do and all of who you are. Thank you. Dear Resident,

Happy New Year to one and all. Best wishes and hopes for the coming year. Thank you also for the support the community have shown the PC over the last year. I thought it might be a good idea to recap the main occurrences over the year as a reminder of where we stand presently...

- Multiple discussions were held with Adam Bunce of the M5 Junction 10 consulting team. The PC managed to prove that traffic through the village would increase exponentially as a result of the works. Accordingly, after much debate, Atkins Realis, the contractor will put in place in late Spring their remedial plan to try to both reduce traffic through the village, and to reduce its speed also. Measures include increased and clearer signage, a 20mph zone through Stoke Orchard, build outs at strategic points, and improved road markings. We hope also to get better, more effective speed reminder signs. The Speedwatch group so active here in the villages, have been dynamic & instrumental in their input in this matter. I would urge anyone who feels strongly about this subject to contact Cllr Sue Shorrock if you feel you can help.
- The Roseleigh development, which will increase the size of Stoke Orchard by some 30%, was granted planning permission by TBC. This reflects greatly National Government's house-building edict to build one and a half million new homes in the country. Bearing this in mind, the council strove to achieve the best possible result for the Parish in terms of ways to improve the amenities for the villages through 106 and CIL awards. We are currently waiting for the results of TBC's decision on this.
- The Land by the Chapel issue at Banady Lane rumbled on throughout the year. However, with the persistent hard work of the PC solicitor, we have now signed the documents. It should mean that in early 2025 this saga will end after some 12 years and the PC can maintain this public open space.

- In August, we had a lovely pump track built on the Orchard estate, using 106 money provided by Bloor when they built the estate. It proved an immediate success and a further sum of 106 money was approved in December to add another loop to it, making it even better. A gate will be installed at the entrance to the MUGA car park, to allow us to install an outdoor table tennis table. Other plans for this area include a half pipe skateboard area and perhaps some outdoor exercise equipment.
- Flooding also played a part in the Parish. The PC have been proactive in many
 areas, trying to get attention and results from both TBC and Severn Trent. We will
 continue to pursue this with vigour. A further volunteer flood warden also offered
 his services so that we have both villages covered.
- There is so much to list; it's impossible to do it all. Grants were searched for and awarded for the telephone box, heritage boards & solar batteries. Council funds safeguarded in high interest accounts, our newsletter improving (hope you think so)! Tredington bridge repair (to be continued), numerous planning applications considered....never a dull moment! We are resolved to work tirelessly for the greater good of our community. Thank you everyone!
