We've been spoilt with the rather lovely Spring weather. Sadly, the threat of a hosepipe ban is already being mooted by the powers that be, so in a Carlsberg world, we could do with rain at night and sunny days otherwise. We can but dream....

- On the subject of the dry weather, you may have noticed the cracking and
 fissures on the berms of the pump track. The installer, Joe Baddely has been
 made aware and will be attending to fill these asap. In the meantime, I would
 ask that youngsters avoid riding on the berms if possible. Hopefully, with some
 more rain, this will reduce this occurring.
- The defibrillator has now been installed in the telephone box and the emergency services and the Heartbeat Foundation informed. The prizes were presented by the mayor of Cheltenham and it was great to see the youngsters being recognised and praised for their performances.
- I know I sound like a broken record but the impending lease signing for our community shop is so close now. It may even be signed by the time we go to print. Can't wait to tell you all about the new tenant's plans, although I gather the jungle drums have been banging madly! I do wish I could tell you more than rumour but we'll get there.

- Meantime, the 'pop-up' shop seems to be going well, and Nikki has arranged on certain dates, to have a coffee van in the hall car park. Please do try them, as they are a new business.
- The grit bin on Stoke Road has broken its lid. TBC have now got that on their jobs list and the bin will be replaced in due course.
- Tredington Bridge repair work has been delayed for a short while until 2nd June. This was due to a delay in the receipt of materials I gather. I know the road disruption has been a nuisance, but the eyesore barriers will be gone and the safety of the bridge assured after they finish. Another long-term issue gone!
- Roseleigh is moving rapidly along and we have a meeting with the site manager on June 11th.
- The glider in the playpark at the hall is looking a little tired now and could do with a lick of paint. Could we beg for some volunteers to tackle this if at all possible, please? Paint and brushes all supplied.

With the expansion to multiple age groups and the addition of 5 new teams, the need for our own facility has become essential. We are actively exploring local fields and open spaces in and around the Stoke Orchard area with the potential to host multiple pitches, ideally accommodating various age groups simultaneously.

Our vision is to create more than just a set of football pitches - we aim to build a community hub where players, families and supporters can come together to enjoy grassroots football in a safe, welcoming and well-equipped environment.

We are currently in discussion with local landowners and the parish council, and welcome any leads or suggestions from residents who may know of suitable land or partnerships. This is a chance for the wider community to help shape the future of the club.

If successful, this home venue will become a key part of Stoke Orchard FC's identity - a place our teams can truly call their own.

Table tennis and activities will be on offer too.




